

For this year we already have some exciting activities planned and are looking forward to seeing our regular members along with any new members who would like to join us. Although we say 10-00 a.m. - 4.00 p.m there is no obligation to stay all day. You may only have time to come morning or afternoon. That's ok.

February "MIXED BAG" STILL LIFE – Opportunity to do an abstract "Still Life" from items provided. Bring own base (board, canvas, paper) and paints. Candle/wax, textured cloth, oil pastels or graphite pencils may also be used.

March CUBISM - An Art movement which was most influential in the early 20th Century as seen in the work of Picasso. In Cubist artwork objects are broken up and reassembled in an abstract form – simplified by geometric shapes.

May Van Gogh Practise a style using calligraphic lines using fluid brush strokes to create an artwork with the real character and unique qualities of Van Gogh. Exhibitors Fees

Members are reminded that there is a \$2 fee for submitting work in curated exhibitions (Plant Farm and Studio). Please firmly attach a labelled envelope containing \$2 to the back of submitted artwork.

Exhibitors are asked to help out with some studio duty during the exhibition.

Fill in your chosen time slot on the calendar on the noticeboard.

The first Free Space time at the Studio is Tues 3rd Feb - Mon 1st March

About using our Free Space Times:

- 'Expressions of interest list is on the noticeboard':
Please write in what you intend bringing in. (Or ring Chistina or Kathy).

On drop-off, you will need to fill in the Exhibition register as usual.

- About 20 works are needed. Sharing of the space should be emphasised. Individual members can hang 2 to 3 of their works, but not to the exclusion of others.
- Time limit of 4 weeks for a work to be on display.
- Quality of works is important as we advertise our gallery in the media: must be original, and be of exhibition standard. Works previously exhibited in AWAS curated shows are acceptable.

Booking Solo/Joint/SmallGroup Exhibitions at studio.

- For solo/group exhibitions in 'Free Space' times at the studio: fill in the expression of interest list on the noticeboard. Contact: coordinators Christina Zey or Kathy Bruce.

Occupational Health & Safety

As members can hang their own work, safety issues could arise: members should be sure that they are not in the studio alone when climbing ladders etc.

Garden Gallery Café, Wodonga Plant farm: "Summertime" Exhibition

Wednesday 4th February to Tuesday 7th April. Bring works in for hanging Tues Feb 3rd from 3pm.

Figurative Exhibition- Hanging: Monday 2nd March, open 3rd March to 4th May.

A broad definition: A "figurative work" clearly represents an image from the real world, but it may be abstracted. Figurative art does not only refer to representations (or abstractions) of the human figure, but may make strong references to animals or inanimate objects. It may apply to something which suggests a resemblance to a natural form and one which retains a strong reference to the real world. Two people will be rostered on each session for the Figurative exhibition (OH&S)

Charity Exhibition: Van Gogh (July)

The charity chosen is "Headspace". The venue AWAS Paintbox Studio/Gallery.

Broadened criteria for "Van Gogh" auction: It was agreed to include copies ("fakes") as well as works 'inspired' by Van Gogh in the criteria for the exhibition/auction.

Suggested dates are Mon. 13th July Hanging, Tues. 14th July Open to the public, Friday 17th July, 6pm opening and auction. The month of July has been selected for this exhibition as Wed 29th July is the anniversary of Van Gogh's death.

These dates are to be confirmed by the committee, with consideration of availability of auctioneer.

Proposal for "AWAS AWAY ARTIST" Trip for a group of 12 artists to Warrnambool Sept Oct 2015 (Contact Lin Starke)

Following some preliminary discussions this is where planning is this week.

- Suggested dates - Depart 28 Sept return 1 Oct 2015
 - Travel, following concerns about driver tiredness further investigation found that we can actually travel by train all the way on "V-line" and return on "V-line" travelling Albury Wodonga to Southern Cross, with a meal break there (own cost) in one of several food halls, browse the shops upstairs, gather again for the second stage of the day's journey. Southern Cross to Warrnambool. Timetables will be available at the meeting this week for discussion Concession tickets for those who have them mean travel is free both ways. Otherwise the fare will be \$45-50 both ways.
 - The Plan once in Warrnambool is have a 12 seater bus waiting for us at the Railway station in Warrnambool which we will hire until leaving when we return the bus to the station. The bus hire including one day trip to the 12 Apostles is \$50 per head for the 3 days.
 - Accommodation will be at the Big 4 Camping ground in the 3 Studio Apartments there. Each studio has a double bed room and 3 single beds in the lounge area. There are no bunks in the Studio Apartments. Cost per each person \$50. Rating 4.5 star. I will get an info pack from the Big 4 owners but we can look up detail on-line
 - Contact with the Warrnambool Artist Society will focus now on asking them for best venues for outdoor painting. They have their own studio, and there are three other galleries to visit.
 - I will request at the meeting this week any ideas for shared activities or to ask about.
 - A day painting with them seems a good idea , and a shared social evening.
 - My intention is to ask about hire of portable tables and chairs from a hire centre in Warrnambool. This will mean we can keep our luggage on the train to a minimum. If the cost is too high then maybe the artist society will have tables and chairs
 - I will contact the Information Centre in Warrnambool and request information for us to share. I will also ask for details of scenic lookouts where toilets are provided close by.
 - Entertainment will be the Sound and Light Show "Shipwrecked" for \$16 each on one night.

- Food provision options to be discussed.
 - Eat out the whole time
 - Purchase breakfast and lunch foods according to dietary needs for your cabin or for the whole group. Look up what cooking facilities we have available to us. Share costs or pay own provisions.
 - Eat out each evening, own cost.
 - Take two chilli Bins and ice packs for days when we paint el fresco, to provide packed lunches. Also a first aid kit and emergency contact details for members.

This trip is feasible for \$116.00 per person plus food (with travel concession), priced for all members to be able to enjoy this event.
