Report: Weekend workshops with Steve McCall 13th and 14th July



Our one day weekend workshops with Steve were a great success. 12 members on Saturday and 8 on Sunday.

The Saturday subject was "Snow is not White" in any medium and we had watercolour, acrylics and pastels all on the go. Steve told us about underpainting colours we could use and all the colours in "white" snow – warmer in the foreground and cooler in the background. We painted

Australian alpine scenes – no pines trees! Six from Saturday came again on Sunday

for "Pastels" and Janelle Hoban and Donna Johnstone joined us. It was great Donna came as she contributes so much on the committee and, working five days a week, can't take full advantage of her membership. John Stevenson, a relatively new member and storeroom refurbisher, came both days, so it was good introduction to our workshops for him.





Joan Fisher has been ill, but she came for both days and is so glad to be back to her art.

On the Sunday we painted landscapes. Steve gave us a comprehensive talk about the best colours to buy for a basic Australian landscape palette. The choice of the colour of pastel paper (or underpainting) was interesting e.g. complementary colours.







Members have asked to have Steve back next year to do a seascape pastel class with an emphasis on skies and clouds.

"Colour Mixing and Plant Portraits" Workshop October 19th and 20th.

Our tutor will be Christine Cansfield-Smith, a local botanical artist from Beechworth. The weekend will include a very valuable exercise on colour mixing using only the two reds, two blues and two yellows. You will paint colour charts which will be an invaluable resource for your paintings no matter which medium you use. (see below)


Christine supplies all the materials required, participants only need to bring pencils and paper.


The colour mixing exercises will be done with Winsor and Newton watercolours on artist quality Arches paper ready printed to be used. Brushes also supplied.

Also, a simple approach to drawing plants using graphite pencils (this may even be a piece of fruit e.g. an apple) – nothing complicated and detailed. Then making a painting of the subject with the

watercolours provided.

The Albury Wodonga Arts & Cultural Festival will reflect the high-quality calibre of our creative community through a carefully curated program of events, workshops and cultural experiences for all

The festival will offer a stage for professional creative organisations to demonstrate the very best of their artistic ability.

Events and activities will alternate and overlap between the two cities:

We are inviting our cultural and creative organisations to participate over the four days and are very keen to talk with you about any ideas you have to support or participate in the festival.

One idea Albury and Wodonga councils have been discussing is hosting an open galleries day and public art tour across Albury Wodonga on Monday 9 March from 9-1pm. An opportunity to showcase our local galleries and creative industries, an opportunity to host an exhibition, activity, work shop or seminar. This could be a free or ticketed activity. We are keen to speak with you further about these ideas.

AWAS' main contribution to this festival will be our AWAS Members Exhibition and Open Studio. Members will be working at their easels or work tables inside and also outdoors: On Sunday at the Festival at Noreuil Park in Albury we will ask members to be painting outdoors by the river, and again on Monday outside our studio members exhibition.

The AWAS Members' Exhibition. March 9th 2020

This exhibition will be our major exhibition for the 2020- (like we once used to have ANNUAL EXHIBITIONS).

More details on this to come, but please plan to have your best work for the year on show for this important time. The Festival will promote the exhibition in their advertising and there will be a good crowd attending the activities at the Causeway this Victorian long weekend.

Perhaps you can start planning your exhibition contribution and start practising outdoor painting by joining our Plein-air (outdoor painting) activities as the weather warms up in Spring.

Famous Fakes for Murray Valley Sanctuary Refugee Group. April 2020

Thank you to those members who have already started their donated "Fakes" artwork, and have let me know the title and source artist, to pass on to the organisers. They want to keep the repetition of works to a minimum. Eg. We don't want multiple Van Gogh "Sunflowers". The event is planned for 24th April at Adamshurst, a beautiful historic building in the heart of Albury. Details as we receive them will be forwarded by email to members and will be on the notice board at the studio.

Studio News

We have a really fresh, clean storeroom! Thank you to those who have reorganized shelving and painted. Looks great! If you have not had a painting day in the studio, why not plan to have one soon. Some days only one or two come in. There is a member's book to record your name in and to communicate any messages to others using the studio.

WORKS IN PROGRESS: The Studio exhibitions. We need to encourage our artists to hang works up in the studio straight after workshops, to ensure we have a good display showing the processes covered in the workshop. Many people take work home to complete to exhibition standard, which is not the intention of the display. Often the work does not reappear to be hung in the studio.

Jill Scanlon has offered to coordinate "filling in the blank walls" and she will be happy to help to get works up. She and others are usually there Wednesdays and on Mixed Media Saturdays. When we see there are blank walls, we will email everyone and see if they have work available to go up. There was some discussion at the informal General meeting after the AGM about members using the studio for solo exhibitions. If you have any comments about this, can you let me know before the General meeting Wednesday 21st August.
