New Albury Regional Art Gallery Briefing – Jenny Wallace

Ten members of AWAS attended a briefing on the new Regional Art Gallery on the 26th June. Jacqui Hemsley, Group Leader Cultural Services, Albury City, and Bianca Acimovic, Visual Arts Coordinator - Albury Art Gallery, gave us an interesting insight into the vision and scope for the new Regional Art Gallery. The key highlights of the discussion were:

- The gallery will have a broad arts focus covering both contemporary and traditional art forms
- There will be 7 flexible gallery spaces 2 of which will be dedicated to the gallery's permanent collection
- Opening hours and access to the galleries facilities will be more flexible
- Facilities will include gallery rooms, educational/studio work space, restaurant and sculpture garden
- Major Objective is to create the gallery as a destination for the local community and visitors
- Educate the community on the value of art
- Closer relationships with other arts groups such as the Art Society
- Fostering awareness of local artists through exhibitions, workshops and other partnership programs
- The Library Museum will house exhibitions while the new Gallery is being built. For example, the Archibald prize exhibition in March 2014
- The need to keep organisations like AWAS on the communication and development loop

Jacqui, congratulated the Albury Wodonga Art Society on its strong membership base and art program in an environment where many Art Societies are folding because of their inability to adapt to change. Jacqui also expressed the view that our members received excellent value with a working studio/gallery, the resources available to members and the programs we run for members.

Those members who attended enjoyed the discussion and the chance to express their views on a range of things.

Life Drawing

Unfortunately I was out of the country for the last life drawing session in June so I would like to thank Elsie for filling in for me while I was away.

Back in April we decided to run two experimental life drawing sessions that would play with the contrast of light and dark on the human form. These two special Monday night sessions saw us observing and drawing the model in a variety of light situations. These ranged from back lighting to front lighting. Lighting that was sometimes harsh and sometimes soft and often combined with coloured lighting. The artists to, experimented with drawing in the half light or even with headlamps!

All of this could not have been possible without the enthusiastic participation of our two models, who were able to work with the lighting in interesting and creative ways. As a group I felt that we have learnt much about contrasting light and how to deal with it which should hold us in good stead for later night sessions.

Our next Saturday life drawing session will be held on July 6th at the normal time of 1 to 4pm.

In August, however, because of the Pastel workshop, life drawing will be held on **Saturday August 10th from 1 to 4pm** following the morning Acrylic Group session. Any members of the Acrylic Group are most welcome to join in the life drawing/painting session.
