If you follow Australian painting don't miss the exhibition "Australians in France" at the Potter Gallery. It closes on the 6th September.

Remember that the "TURNER FROM THE TATE" closes on the 15th September at the National Gallery in Canberra.

If in Sydney and visiting the NSW Gallery before the 7th October go along to see the "SYDNEY MODERNS" Over 180 works by Australia's most iconic artists, exploring the making of a modern city.


