A Word from our President

The **Winter Blues exhibition** is still on display at the Wodonga Plant Farm Garden Gallery Cafe and will remain so until August 4. If you haven't already seen it please make sure you do so. I believe Kylie Waldon has already successfully sold her painting at the time of writing so, congratulations Kylie. The Free Space Studio exhibition continues with members hanging their own works and ensuring our walls remain covered with inspirational works of art. As previously mentioned, the space is available until we hang the Van Gogh exhibition. This exhibition will now be hung on Saturday 25th July so please bring your paintings into the Studio from Wednesday 22 July. Make sure you have signed them with your own names and have detailed the works on the back of your paintings. Information regarding signing of the works is on the notice board for your information.

Peter Drummond has emphasised a total of 40 paintings being the ideal number for the evening auction. Following this, it has been decided that any further Van Gogh paintings that do not go to auction will be displayed in the Studio as Van Gogh Inspirations exhibition during the free space for sale in a private capacity. So please keep on painting your inspirational works. They will be shown as an exhibition for a further month until the first week in September when the free space will again be made available.

On Saturday 13 June during the Acrylic workshop, the Border mail visited the studio, at the invitation of the sub-committee, to photograph any completed Van Gogh works and to also photograph members still painting them. They also made contact with Heather Green and Lin Starke for preparing an article that was published the following Monday 15 June. The works already finished are a fantastic display of wonderful art by members and there is such a great variety of Van Gogh inspirations and copies, often interpreted in a personal way by individual artists. The sub-committee continues with its planning operations including advertising, preparing rosters for the evening, contributions from members regarding food and wine, and raffle tickets. Their endless work has not gone unnoticed.

The Circuit Open Studios was successful during our studio opening on the weekend of 20 and 21 June with many visitors passing by and coming in to appreciate the paintings on view. They seemed to

enjoy watching the demonstrations and talking about art with members. The opening at the Atura Hotel, Albury, on the Friday evening was also a splendid night with paintings by Carol Gilbert and Glenys Baxter chosen to represent AWAS.

Discussions are ongoing with Bianca Acimovic regarding our 2016 exhibition at the Murray Art Museum Albury (MAMA). Progress continues to be made and further discussions with Bianca are continuing.

POP ART - Andy Warhol (b. 1931 Pittsburgh) was one of the leading exponents of Pop art . He began his career as a painter in 1960 when Larry Rivers, Roy Lichenstein, Robert Rauschenberg, Jasper Johns and Jim Dine were painting everyday imagery - popular motifs.

The mass produced look - controlled - eg. Warhol's Campbell's soup cans and Jim Dine's Black Bathroom No. 2

Pop art - reaction against abstraction which led to a type of figurative painting which is a witty, allusive movement, with its interest in popular imagery and strip - cartoon commercial art.

So the idea is to come and try your interpretation of POP ART. Bring paints etc. and masking tape (for hard edges) and fun items to paint or use what is here and we can (get it !! can) set up a still life or do a Marilyn Monroe style portrait - your choice Thanks enquiries this time to Pauline (0410729309) see you there.

VAN GOGH EXHIBITION:

At a recent meeting with Peter Drummond, it was agreed to cap the entries for the Van Gogh Exhibition at 40 odd to prevent the evening from becoming overly long. At present there are 43 entries with 2 on the waiting list. If you have any concerns, please contact me. (Heather Green ph. 60246523)

The exhibition is to be hung on Saturday 25th July. (suggest that works are dropped in prior to this) When entering your paintings, there is no \$2 fee or sign-in register. Instead a specific form has been designed. As well as the usual information, it asks for the name & year the original work was painted by Van Gogh. It also asks for a sentence or two about your painting. These comments will be collated and passed on to the auctioneer to assist in his presentation. (Comments may be serious, funny etc. – any way you wish). When completed, this form is to be attached to the bottom right hand corner of the painting. After the hanging of the works, these will be collected and used to create the catalogue, numbering system & the auctioneer's information sheet.

The raffle will be drawn on auction night, so tickets will need to be back by then. More tickets are available for those who want them. Thank you to all who have helped out with this.

There are now 4 prizes:

ADFAS – Australian Decorative and Fine Arts Society – Murray River

The next lecture for ADFAS is on Friday, 10th July. The lecturer is Barry Venning from the UK. The lecture topic is “The Sincerest Form of Flattery” and it deals with artistic borrowing, drawing on a very wide range of art and design, including painting, sculpture, photography, graphic design and fashion. The artists on whom Barry touches are include Constable, Leonardo, Manet, Warhol, Turner, Dali, Harry Beck (creator of the London Tube map) and Alexander McQueen (fashion designer). It concludes with the strange ‘afterlife’ of Alfred Leete’s famous World War 1 recruiting poster of Lord Kitchener. The visual presentation of this lecture should be very interesting and as diverse as the artists represented.

This time the lecturer is at La Trobe Uni rather than our usual venue, The Cube.

I would really encourage AWAS members to come along. The evening begins at 6.00 o’clock with drinks and finger foods and the lecturer is from 6.45. – 7.45.

The following lecture is on Friday, 7th August at The Cube and the topic is “The Imperial Easter Eggs of Carl Faberge – After the Revolution”.
