The Van Gogh Charity Exhibition successfully ended, the spring exhibition, <u>La Prima Vera</u>, is nearing its end and a brand new Black and White exhibition will take its place at the Gallery Cafe, Plant Farm Wodonga. This exhibition will run from 6<sup>th</sup> October until 1 December and will be followed by a Christmas exhibition called <u>Little Gems</u>, lasting until mid January 2016.

The AWAS Studio Gallery will host a members' exhibition from 2<sup>nd</sup> November until the re-opening on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2016. There will be an informal opening on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> November with members catering.

### 'Portraits' and 'Still Life' at the Grampians: Report

I've just spent a glorious 6 days at Halls Gap at the 'Grampians Brushes'. I went to two workshops: Still life for two days and Portraits for four days. Both workshops were tutored by Paul McDonald Smith, a very talented and well known Melbourne artist.

Halls Gap is a magnificent venue. Not only is it very beautiful, tucked away as it is between escarpments, waterfalls and walking tracks, but the community of artists that take over the town at this time is truly inspirational. There is plenty of accommodation of all kinds, excellent restaurants and cafes, ice cream shops to die for, and everything within walking distance.

There were 20 tutors, 367 students and workshops of all sorts. Lunch and morning tea was delivered to every workshop venue and the organisation went like clockwork. Check out their website for details.

One tip offered by my tutor for those interested in portraits – skin colour; white, ochre and cadmium red. I have heard of other combinations but these colours make quite an orangey mix which works surprisingly well.

The next lecture: The Drama behind the Taj Mahal (Mughal Painting at its Zenith and the Life and times of the Indian Emperor, Shah Jahan)

When: Friday, 9<sup>th</sup> October 6.00pm for wine and nibbles; lecture 6.45 – 7.45pm.

The lecture is based on the Islamic manuscript, the Padshahnama (chronicle of the King of the World) which is the unique official history of the Mughal Emperor, Shah Jahan, who ruled India from 1628 to 1658. He is best remembered for the building of the Taj Mahal as a tomb for his favourite wife, Mumtaz Mahal. The Padshahnama is illustrated with 44 of the finest Mughal paintings in the world. They vividly depict the very dramatic events in the Emperor's reign and the years before it.
