Studio Matters

The beginning of a new year is a good time to be reminded of the great studio space we have! Are you considering coming to work in the studio- on weekdays? Weekends? Evenings? Workshops? Remember it is a shared space. Plan the materials you will use, keep to a minimum the art materials and artworks you leave there overnight. Consider carefully storage, and be mindful of events and workshops planned to take place in the studio. All members are expected to take care and respect artist's work drying in the studio. Sometimes things do need to be moved- please take care.

Planning an AWAS event?

When organizing exhibition open times and workshop dates, try to avoid the life drawing sessions being held in the studio (first Saturday of the month) as these sessions cannot be accessed by the public. Advertising needs to state all dates closed. Open dates mean the studio must be manned, so firm commitments are needed at these times. ie. a roster needs to be kept.

In order to prevent any clashes in events, please consult the committee in the planning stage. All dates (and costs) for workshops and exhibitions need to be authorized by Committee. Coordinators, please try to keep regular contact with someone on the committee so we can help make everything run smoothly.

A ONE DAY COACH TRIP TO BENDIGO ART GALLERY. Wed. 15th May with Martins Bus & Coach company.

"Tudors to Windsors: British Royal Portraits" at the Bendigo Art Gallery from 16th March to 14th July. Tudors to Windsors" traces the history of the British monarchy through the outstanding collection of the National Portrait Gallery, London. This exhibition highlights major events in British (and world) history from the sixteenth century to the present, examining the ways in which royal portraits were impacted by both the personalities of individual monarchs and wider historical change. Presenting some of the most significant royal portraits, the exhibition will explore five royal dynasties: the Tudors, the Stuarts, the Georgians, the Victorians and the Windsors shedding light on key figures and important historical moments.

To bring these royal figures to life, Bendigo Art Gallery has secured key loans of historic fashion, armour and personal effects which will be featured alongside these magnificent and imposing portraits."
