THE FAMOUS FAKES CHARITY ART AUCTION

The Murray Valley Sanctuary Refugee Group (MVSRG) initiated this art auction in 2019. The Albury Wodonga group is affiliated with the Australia-wide Sanctuary Refugee Foundation. They sponsor and help families and individuals from refugee camps around the world to settle into our community. This fund-raising auction in just one of the activities they are involved in.

We were invited to take part in this event way back in 2019, and some of our members have submitted works for this event which has been postponed throughout the pandemic.

The new date is October 22nd 2022.

They have put in a call for more paintings, so this is a chance to get back into painting by studying the masters! Choose an easily recognisable artwork by a famous artist (must be deceased). 3D works can be also submitted. Size limit 76.2x91.4cm (30*x36"). The finished work needs to be framed and will be donated, so keep this in mind when deciding on size and framing.
