President's Report 2023

Another year has passed and we have successfully attracted a number of new members. In a nutshell, AWAS is still surviving as long as we continue to have the interest of members who are prepared to sit on the Committee. Without such volunteers we will not survive.

In 2022 we held a major members' exhibition "Colours on the Causeway" which opened on 23rd September. Unfortunately there was only a small number of exhibitors and few volunteering to assist in publicity which resulted in attracting very few visitors. I mention this at this point since we are again considering to hold such a major exhibition in September/October 2024. Indeed, the plan has been to have major members' exhibitions every two years with the signature title "Colours on the Causeway" and displaying the relevant year. These exhibitions would be held in the Studio but unless members are prepared to form a Sub-Committee to organise them, the plan will not go ahead.

Another function of our members' participation at the end of 2022 was the "Famous Fakes" auction held in October and organised by the Murray River Sanctuary Refugee Group. Members created and donated paintings that were copies of well recognised masters born in the last century or earlier. \$15,000 was raised to help resettle refugees into our local community. The organiser, Lyn Frauenfelder, thanked AWAS for our support.

This year has seen a number of workshops with an adequate participation rate. The recent soft pastels tutored workshop with Steve McCall was not only informative but also enjoyable,

as were the other workshops. The pastels workshop generated an interest with some of the participants and continues with follow up days organised by Judy Balfour. Budding new pastelists are enthusiastically participating with interesting results.

The Watercolour workshop towards the end of August with Terry Jarvis could do with more members joining it.

I thank Judy Balfour for her endless work in organising tutors, billeting some of them, and encouraging members to attend. While her enthusiasm is contagious, we request members to be pro-active in seeking out possible tutors for future workshops, especially for Acrylics and Mixed Media.

Life Drawing sessions continue to be popular, so much so that Gateway Gallery has decided to follow the example by starting their own sessions. Olga Juskiw, co-ordinator, has successfully organised the sessions and the models making them enjoyable for all which has resulted in an attendance that has met the required costs to run them. The Life Drawing marathon, held in January this year, as in past years, was well attended by members and non-members who found it challenging but enjoyable. Thanks goes to Olga for her consistent dedication.

The Portrait sessions, organised by Janelle Hoban, have sadly not attracted the participation of previous years, despite Janelle's ability to find interesting models of varied age, ethnicity and character. Consequently Janelle has stepped down for the immediate future. The group sessions will be reviewed in the new year with the hope that they will again resume. Action and interest from members is required.

The Acrylics Group, under the auspices of Jill Scanlon, continues to meet with enthusiasm. Many interesting results can be seen decorating the studio walls, not only by the group but also by members generally. Regular change over of works occurs and Jill is assisted by Heather Green, Tania Healey and Tony Smit. Dates for these are well advertised. Thank you.

The exhibition space at the Wodonga Plant Farm Gallery Café has continued to be successful with a healthy number of sales. AWAS is thankful to the generosity of the Pollard family who offer the space gratuitously. Observation of works for these exhibitions has exposed the need for greater size variations. Larger works are encouraged as is greater creative thinking when considering the themes. Many thanks to Tania Healey and her team of helpers.

AWAS expressed sadness and gave our condolences at the loss of the matriarch, Kay Pollard who passed away during the year. She was a most generous hostess to AWAS enabling us to exhibit and sell in the Gallery Café.

Further sadness was expressed for the passing of one inaugural member, John Mason. Also this year we farewelled another member, Robert Rhodes. May they all RIP.

To conclude, let us hope for a continued and increased interest in AWAS activities with beautiful creations being made and displayed for all to admire.

Thank you for another wonderful year with particular thanks to the current Committee. May we continue to exist.

Treasurer's Report, 2023

As we all know the whole of the economy has suffered difficulties in these recent years and the attached report for our year shows that as well.

Due to this it is important to bring to the notice of members that our Society has made loss in the last three years:

2021 Loss \$ 311 2022 Loss \$1,216 2023 Loss \$3,296 This we cannot sustain.

Whilst the number of members has stayed somewhat constant, it is because there has been a fairly steady number of new members to replace retiring members, so at 30 June we had 68 on the members register. Regardless of outside reasons, our losses have been caused by a drastic reduction in the number of workshops being held, and supported, along with the rising costs which are steadily increasing.

To overcome such losses in this and future years it is obvious that the support of members attending workshops and studio sessions of Life Drawing and Portraits is an essential part of a recovery.

I appeal to all members to consider how they each can add to the needed difference to ensure our Society can continue in the long term. This can be done by supporting workshops and studio sessions and volunteering to be a member of the committee to contribute your "bit".

It is worth remembering that the committee membership is not a huge task and that you may enjoy adding your contribution.

Thank you to all members who have supported our studio exhibitions over the last year. We have had some very good feed- back from visitors about the variety of work exhibited. In our next year we will continue to change the exhibitions in the alternate month to the Wodonga Plant Farm, to give our members breathing space between our exhibitions. Bring work in on the Tuesday before we set up for the studio exhibition on the first Wednesday of the month following the month of the Plant Farm exhibition.

We do not curate the exhibitions nor suggest themes. This is purely a chance to bring in your work and exhibit. Please clearly label your paintings with your name, the medium, a title, a price and a contact number. We list all paintings on a sheet in the studio and ask that you sign them out when you pick them up at the end of the exhibition.

We struggled last year to do an Annual Exhibition and did have to ring members to remind them to bring works in. There will not be an Annual Exhibition this year but we hope to have a major exhibition next year. Covid severely disrupted our access to the studio and it was difficult to mount exhibitions throughout that time.

I would like to thank the Coordinators of the various Workshops for producing such interesting and varied works for us to exhibit after their workshops and I encourage members to participate in those workshops. I would particularly like to thank Heather Green, Tony Smit and Tanya Healy for their help in setting up these exhibitions-I could not do without you!!
